Working from Home



- Almost a third of Scottish businesses said their employees normally work from home one or two days a week – with 16.5% of companies reporting staff do this 3 or 4 days a week
- In Scotland, hybrid working is in place in 49.1% of firms, compared with 42.7% of companies across the UK

- In 2019 in the UK, 1 in 10 worked from home once a week; by 2022 had risen to 1 in 5
- ScotRail revenues are still less than 2020; patronage relative to England and Wales is down
- Maximising virtual <u>and</u> inperson opportunities in the workplace will benefit our economy






Context - Scotland's Railway Network



- 2,834 route km (11% of GB Railway); 8.9% of annual changes to DfT equivalent funding
- 361 stations and still growing (Inverness Airport Railway station) – February 2023
- Pre Covid 2,450 passenger services, with circa 100m passengers p.a.
- May 2023 timetable 2,150 services
- Pre Covid circa 45-50 freight trains per day
- Currently freight at pre Covid levels and growing strongly



Rail Spend in Scotland, including OMR



- Scottish Ministers HLOS and SoFA published February 2023
- Network Rail Scotland Strategic Business Plan March 2023
- ORR Final Determination on Scottish Ministers' Requirements October 2023
- Scottish Ministers' CP6 HLOS Requirements completed and planning and preparation for Control Period 7 (CP7) – Ongoing till March 2024
- Network Rail Delivery Plan for Control Period 7 Published March 2024
- CP7 Commences April 2024
