





On 29 April 2019, the Welsh Government declared a climate emergency.

Our sustainable development and environmental legislation is already recognised as **world-leading** and now we must use that legislation to set a new pace of change.





Llys Cadwyn furniture

Working with Rype Office and Merthyr Institute for the Blind we remanufactured desks, sourced coffee tables made locally from recycled chopping boards and black plastic bags and created the world's most sustainable sofa comprised of 100% recycled polyester, a frame made from recycled post-consumer plastic, recycled for ushions, and recycled plastic zip









79% of furniture was up-cycled from our old office and other organisations

Furniture was handcrafted in Pentre by employees of Merthyr Institute for the Blind.

We saved 92,784 kgs

COze and 32,141 kgs of
furniture. We also
saved 2,500kgs carbon

The Nature Emergen

On June 30th 2021, the Welsh Government declared a nature emergency in what has been described as a landmark moment. The Senedd is one of the first parliaments in the world to declare such an emergency

17% of species in Wales at risk of extinction







We now have an obligation to reset biodiversity targets and to back those up with investment, with plans for nature-based solutions, projects to centre on species recovery and changes that will prioritise healthy green and blue habitats across Wales

Making more space for nature to become abundant once again will give our struggling wildlife the chance to recover and also restore beautiful wild places - places that store carbon and help to tackle the climate crisis.

30% is the bare minimum that nature needs to start recovering but we are far short of this





£100,000 was granted from the National Heritage Lottery Fund as part of Welsh Government's Local Places for Nature scheme to enhance biodiversity at and near our stations across our network in Wales











We're making improvements to 22 stations across Wales with our station adopters and volunteers



We worked with community partners and groups to enhance biodiversity in 5 community areas
